The School Board, working with district leadership and the Center for Educational Effectiveness have designed these critical indicators of district performance to help us monitor our progress toward achieving our mission.

- A. [Academic Performance](#): In the core areas of English/Language Arts, Mathematics, and Science, how are we doing?
- B. [Post-Secondary Readiness](#): Our role is to prepare our graduates for a future which enables them to become contributing members of our local and global community. For most, this implies being ready for educational opportunities or training beyond High School.
- C. [Graduation Rate](#): One of the ultimate outcome measures of a *successful* K-12 system.
- D. [Post-secondary Enrollment](#): Post-secondary readiness and graduation rates are leading indicators of opportunities beyond High School; it is also a critical measure to monitor the actual enrollment of our students in post-secondary educational institutions.
- E. [Fiscal Stability](#). While the preceding indicators represent education processes and outcomes, we must operate in a responsible manner that ensures the fiscal stability of the district.

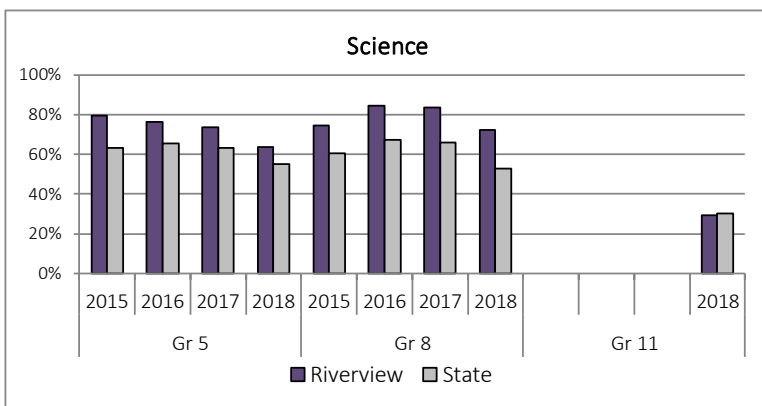
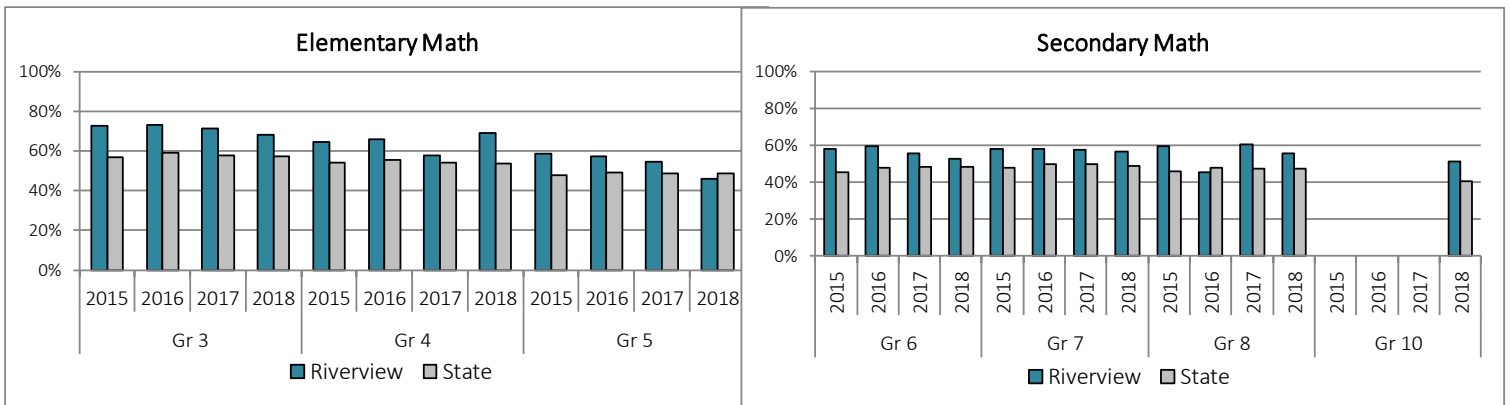
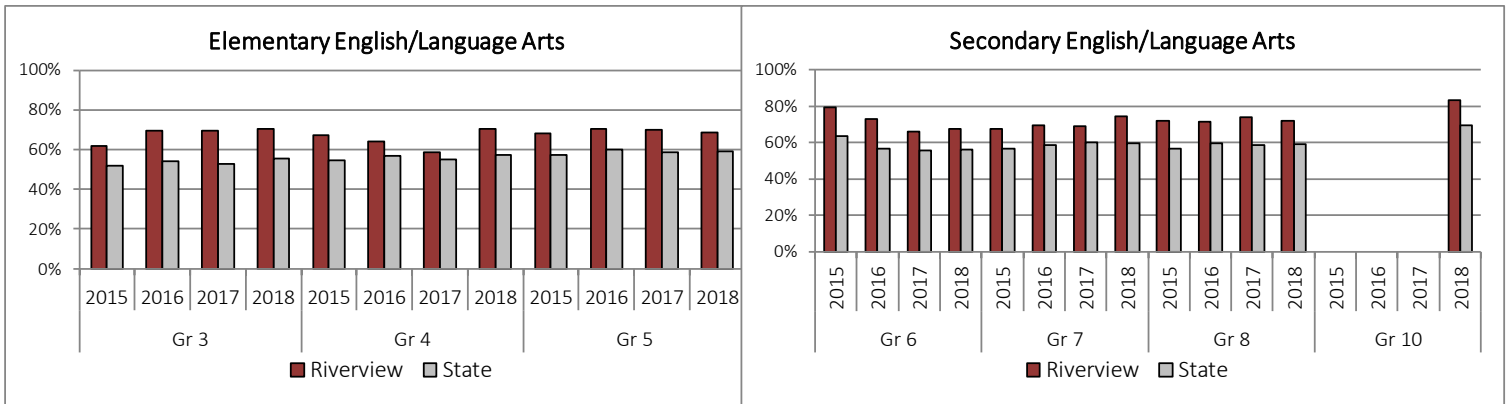
# Critical Indicators Dashboard

## ACADEMIC PERFORMANCE

**Interpretation Notes:** 2017 marks the third year of the Smarter Balanced Assessments in English/Language Arts and Mathematics. These assessments are based on the Common Core State Standards and are more rigorous standards which prepare students with college and career readiness.

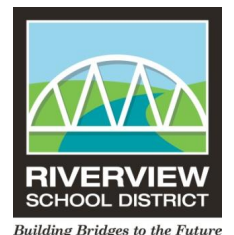
### LEADERSHIP View of Performance

- Riverview School District outperforms the state in all grades and all content areas (exception 5<sup>th</sup> grade Math).
- In 2018, the high school assessment for state accountability changed to 10<sup>th</sup> grade. This is the first year with SBA where all 10<sup>th</sup> graders were expected to take the test so only 2018 data is displayed.



*Note: In 2018 WA state moved the WCAS science assessment for the Next Gen Science Standards (NGSS). These new standards are more rigorous than previous state standards.*

*2018 11<sup>th</sup> graders are not required to pass the assessment for diploma. Therefore, many students either refused to take the exam or did not take it seriously.*

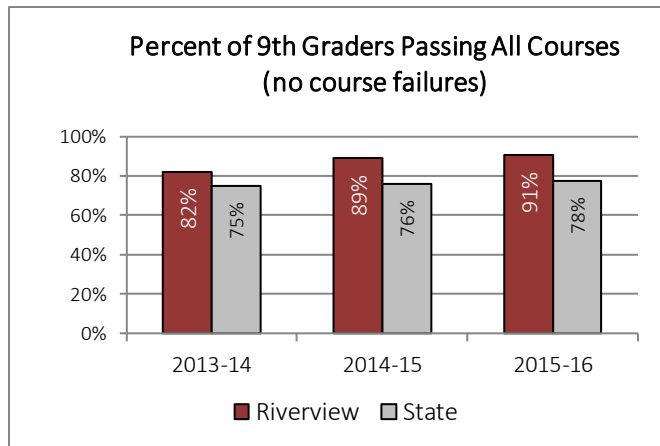


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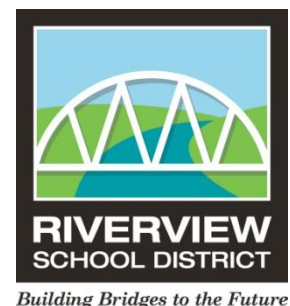
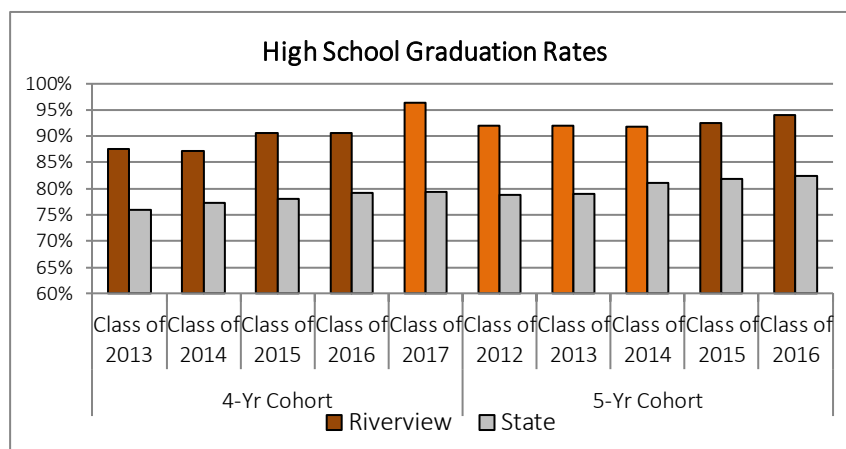
## LEADERSHIP View of Performance

- A K-12 system has graduation rates as a primary measure of effectiveness. One of the most predictive indicators for graduation rate is success at 9<sup>th</sup> grade. The state of WA defines this as receiving credit (passing) all core English-Language Arts, Mathematics, and Science coursework in the freshman (9<sup>th</sup>) year.
- Graduation Rates. Riverview continues to perform well above the state in graduation rates.

## GRADUATION RATES



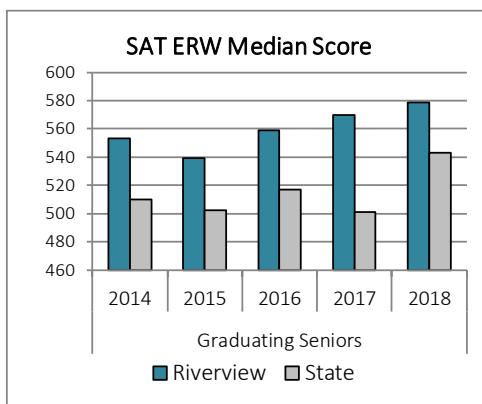
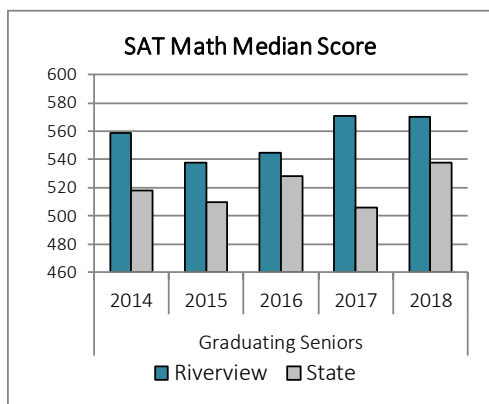

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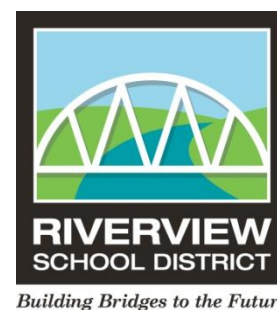
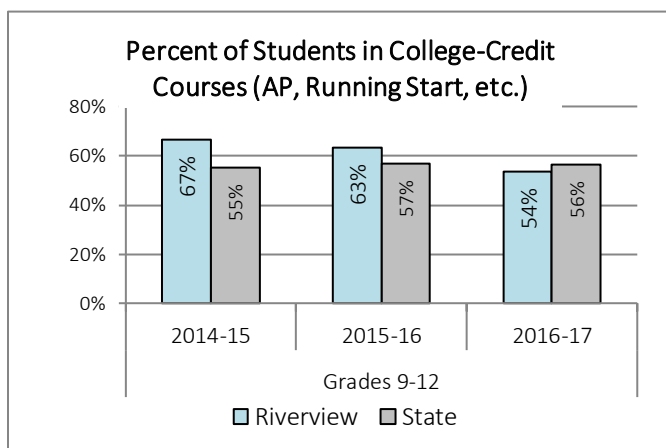
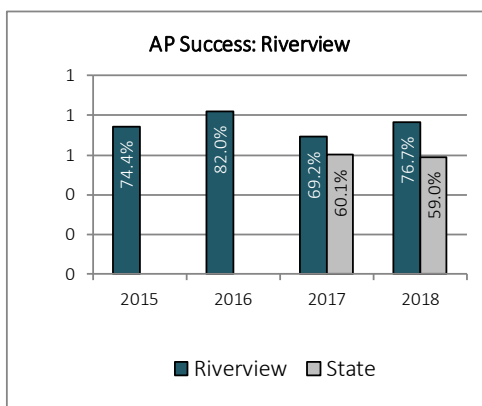
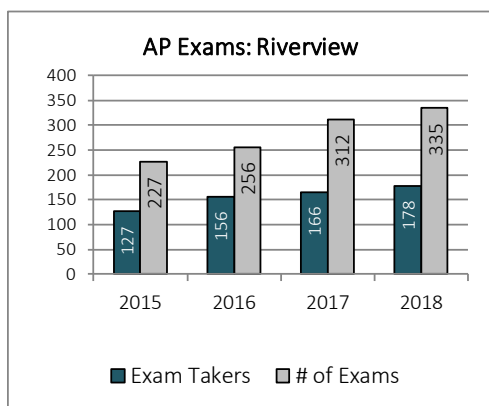
## LEADERSHIP View of Performance

- The SAT is one of the primary college entrance exams used by our students. Riverview continues to outperform the state averages in all three areas of the SAT. 2017 showed strong increases in all three areas of the SAT– English / Reading / Writing, and Math.
- The number and percentage of students taking college credit-bearing classes continues to increase. 2017 saw a dip in the percentage of students receiving college credit based on AP exam success (students receiving a score of 3, 4, or 5). This will be closely monitored.

In 2017, OSPI /College Board are reporting SAT English, Reading, and Writing as a single score.



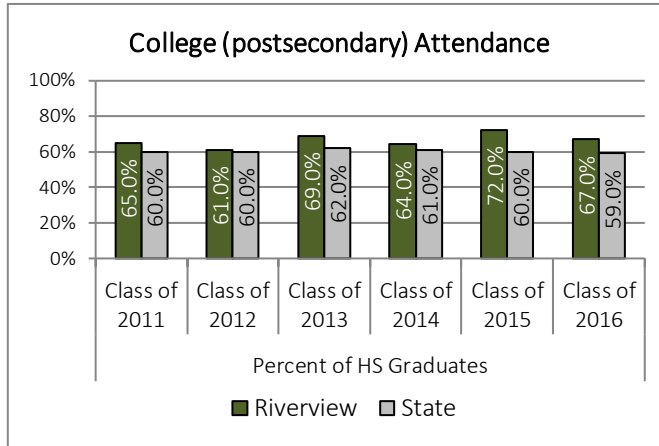

## LEADERSHIP View of Performance

- Riverview students continue to enroll in 2-year and 4-year colleges and universities at a rate above the state. Over the last 3 years, the increase in Riverview has been twice the increase seen throughout the state, with nearly 70% of our students enrolling within their first year of high school graduation.
- Fiscal Stability. Riverview continues to operate in a fiscally responsible manner. We have increased our spending per pupil each of the last three years, while maintaining a Reserve Fund near 10% of budgeted expenditures.

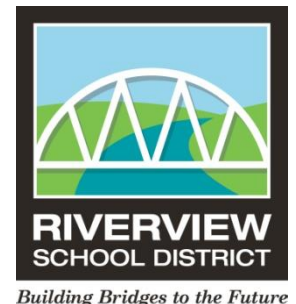
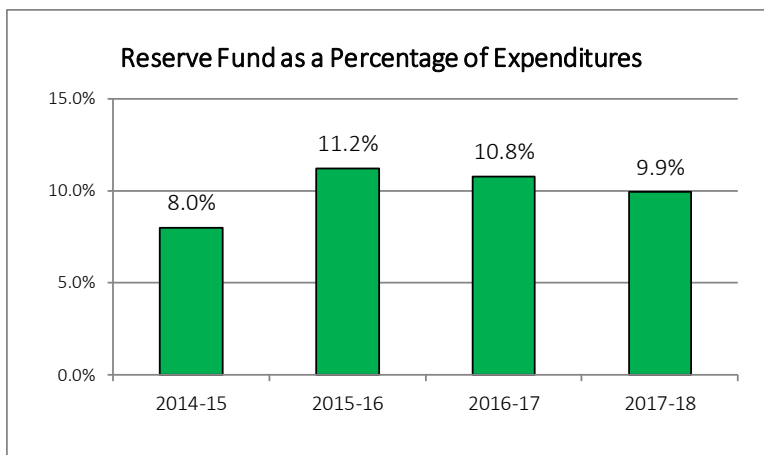
## POST SECONDARY ENROLLMENT
